

On Friday 23rd November 2012 the Office for National Statistics (ONS) published the third phase of the first official release of 2011 Census data, which includes population estimates for wards and super output areas (SOA).

This note provides an initial summary of the headline figures pending more detailed reports to be produced over the next few weeks.

PII has already produced the following reports that are available on Bertha:

- **Census Information Summary** – Headline Borough population and household estimates, age and gender characteristics, changes since 2001 and comparison with other Merseyside districts.
- **Detailed briefing note (in PowerPoint slides)** – providing more information about the estimates in a format that provides a resource for Directors and officers to use.

PII is now working with the latest data release to produce:

- Individual Ward ‘dashboards’ summarising the key statistics
- Individual Partnership Area dashboards
- A detailed briefing note on Wards, drawing out comparative figures around gender, age, change etc
- A detailed briefing note on SOA level population distribution, including maps illustrating change since 1991 and 2001

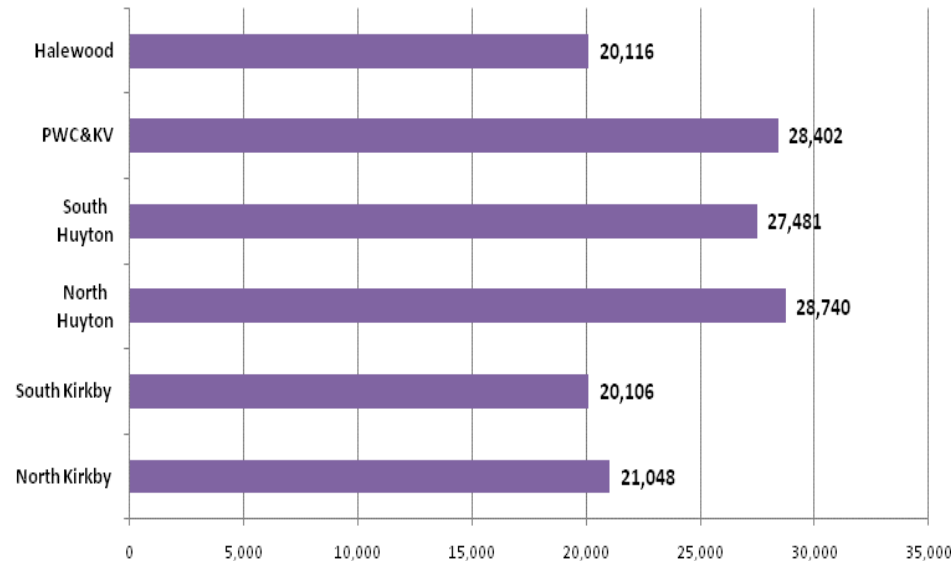
The ONS is due to release further data on 11th December that will include the first estimates of population in terms of ethnicity and international migration. Based on this, PII will produce:

- A ‘Diversity Bulletin’ to summarise key statistics and changes around ethnicity and international migration

The aim is to make as many of these reports as possible available on Bertha (Facts & Figures pages) and via the Council website by 15th December.

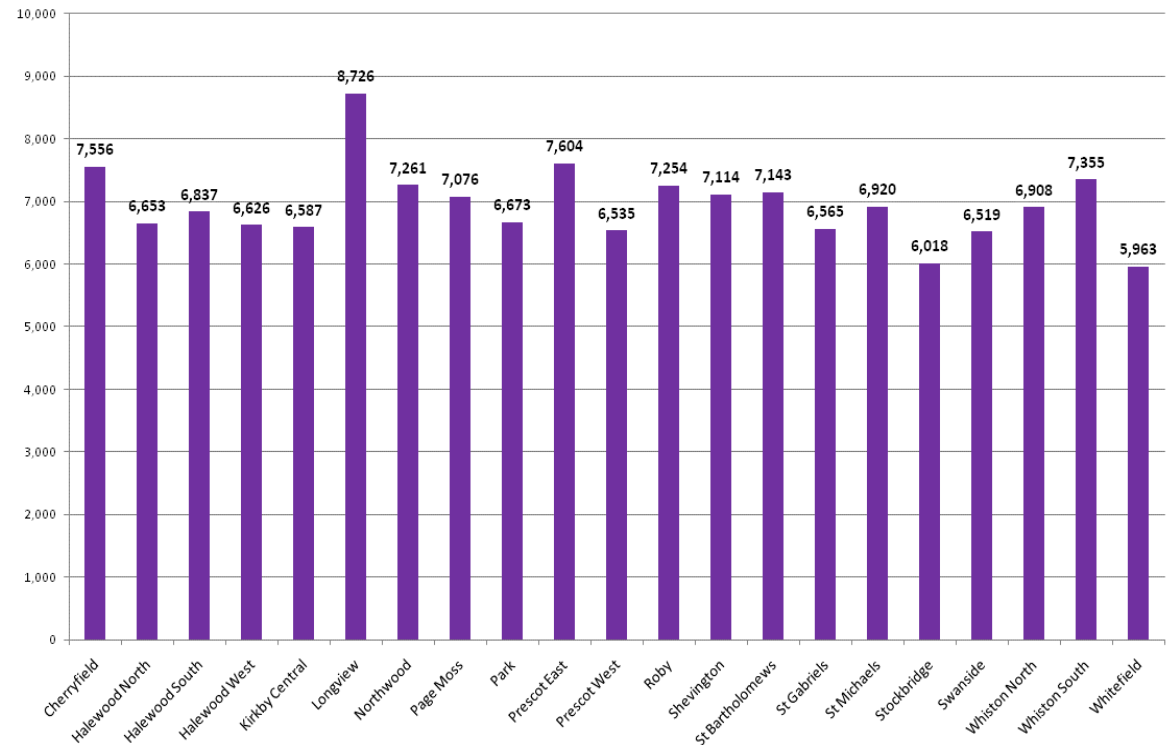
APB POPULATION

- North Huyton is the highest populated APB in Knowsley with 28,740 residents.
- South Kirkby and Halewood are the lowest populated APB's in the Borough with just over 20,000 residents each.



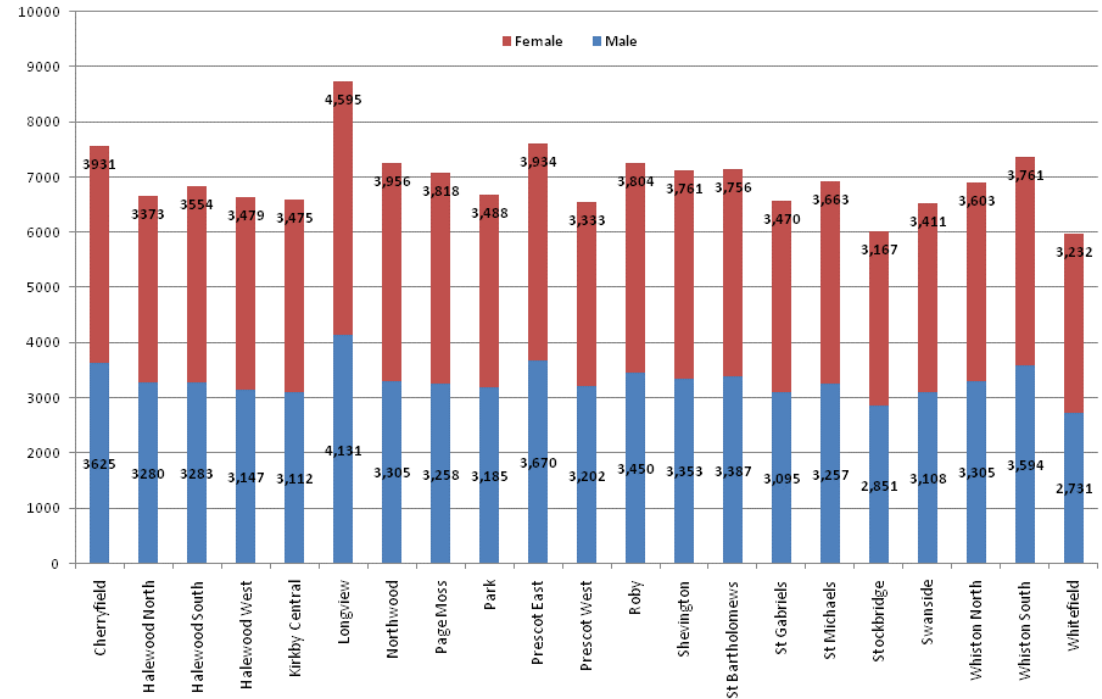
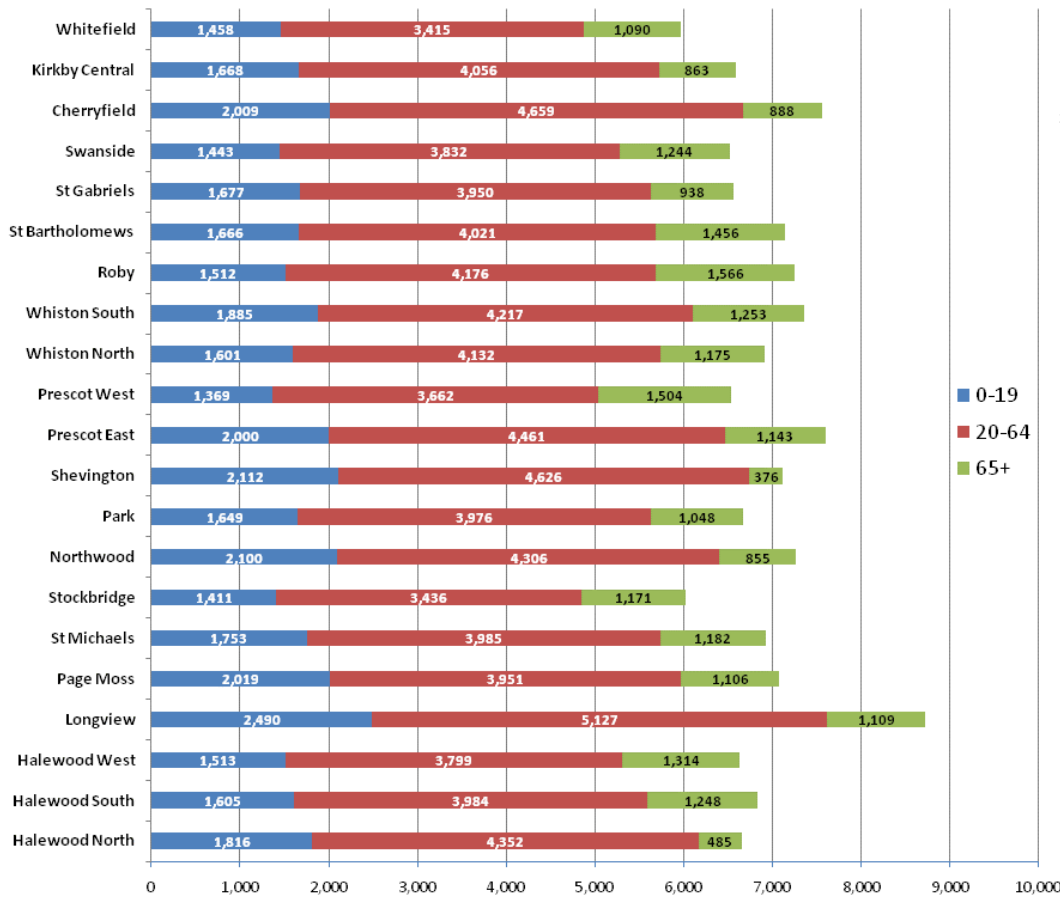
WARD POPULATION

- The highest populated Ward in Knowsley is Longview in North Huyton
- The lowest populated Ward in Knowsley is Whitefield in South Kirkby

- Roby Ward has the greatest number of residents aged 65+ in the Borough (1566).
- Longview has the greatest number of residents aged 0-19 (2490) and the greatest number of working age residents (5127)

- 76,600 of the Borough are females (52.6%)
- 69,300 of the Borough are males (47.4%)
- Trend mirrors the national picture
